



The Nurse POWs of WWII

Almost 100 U.S. military Nurses were taken prisoner of war in WWII in the Philippines and Guam. More than 30 Australian nurses were taken prisoner on the island of Sumatra. All of the nurses heroically provided care for other inmates until their liberation. This inspirational lecture focuses on the chief nurses who encouraged their nurses to maintain rank and provide tireless care to ailing and helpless inmates.
